
WORKSHOP Saturday 18th June 2016 RECORDING GARDENS AND GREEN SPACES

- Sharing & lodging your garden story





Landscapes at Risk – 'Watch and Action' List-April 2016

South Australian Branch

WATCH

• <u>Adelaide Parklands</u> – pressure for active recreation uses (Grand Prix, events, income-generation) at expense of balanced management and passive recreation, risk to National Heritage List values and landscape character.

ACTION

- Mount Lofty Ranges National Heritage Listing and UNESCO World Heritage listing for the "working agrarian landscapes" -- vineyards and farmland in the Adelaide Hills, Barossa Valley and McLaren Vale. Urbanisation, fragmented management, infrastructure upgrades, uncoordinated management by various parties (though improving coordination). NOTE: NOT ÁT RISK'
- <u>Adelaide Botanic Garden</u> lack of state heritage listing only its selected structures are listed. In contrast, Adelaide's parklands are listed on the National Heritage List and holistically managed; <u>Heritage Database</u>




