LOOKING BACK

The branch Christmas function held at Hazel McDougall House in Como was a small but happy gathering which enjoyed a scrumptious afternoon tea and a belated birthday cake for John V. However, that largesse didn't persuade him to make the Chairman's Quiz questions any easier! To shake down the party spoils we took a gentle tree spotting walk in the adjoining park. Neil McDougall, for whom the park is named, bought a bush block in 1914, and operated a dairy on the site until 1946. The South Perth Society for Arts and Crafts now has its headquarters in the former farmhouse. There is a large community garden and some of the outbuildings have been repurposed.

A Guided Walk in the Grounds of University of Western Australia Sunday 15 April

On a perfect autumn afternoon Gillian Lilleyman, co-author with George Seddon of Landscape for Learning: A History of the Grounds of the University of Western Australia, led a walk through some of the extensive grounds and focussed on the work of Henry Campbell and his collaboration with Hubert Whitfeld and the link with the State Gardens Board in the 1920's. Campbell was the Superintendent of the SGB and Whitfeld the University's first Vice-Chancellor. The men had a good and fruitful working relationship which began when Whitfeld expressed concern that the tennis courts being constructed on the foreshore by the SGB would encroach on the University's access to the river. Money from the Hackett Bequest 1926 became available and in 1927 Campbell

appointed on a part time supervisory basis to lay out the grounds.

Members were joined by Friends of the Grounds including Jean Brodie-Hall AM (UWA'S first appointed landscape architect 1974). Jean spoke of using opportunities such as the removal of an asbestos telephone exchange to enhance the grounds and create areas using Australian native plants which required less maintenance. Familiar areas such as the Sunken Garden, the Dolphin and Octagon Theatre surrounds evoked memories for many of the group, as did vistas across ovals and Matilda Bay. Many thanks Gillian for a most interesting and informative afternoon.
