

# You're invited!

## Day 1: Friday 10 September

The conference opens with registration in the Crystal Ballroom of Luna Park, Sydney's iconic, harbourside fun park. Conference lectures on the theme of *Many Dreams*, *One Landscape*, will allow us to explore the phases of change that have influenced the character of Sydney. Speakers include Grace Karskens (keynote speaker), Paul Irish & Michael Ingrey, and Wendy Whiteley. The opportunity is available for optional lunchtime viewing of *Wendy's Secret Garden*. We'll take an afternoon bus to the Waverton Peninsula, for guided walks, and end the day with sunset drinks at the *Coal Loader Platform* overlooking the western arm of Sydney Harbour.

### Day 2: Saturday 11 September

Following the morning lectures, lunch will be enjoyed on a scenic harbour cruise to Sydney's Eastern suburbs. We will visit the colonial gardens of *Rose Bay Cottage* and *Vaucluse House*, one of Sydney's few remaining 19th century mansions still surrounded by its original grounds. We will return to the harbourside at Milsons Point in time to change for the conference dinner at the Kirribilli Club.

## Day 3: Sunday 12 September

We explore the Federation garden suburb of Haberfield and take tea in *Yasmar's* garden. We'll stroll around the nearby *Appian Way* – a rare pocket of garden suburb bungalows. Heading west, we'll lunch in Parramatta, the colony's second settlement and oldest site of inland European settlement in Australia. We'll visit historic *Elizabeth Farm*, home of the Macarthur family and the beginnings of our merino wool industry. The tour will end at *Horsley*, an Indian style bungalow, surrounded by its remnant colonial garden, farm and original outbuildings. *Horsley* overlooks a rural setting, now rare on the Cumberland Plain.

#### Optional Tour: 6–8 September

Pre-conference tour led by Stuart Read, departing from Sydney. Three day, two night tour (staying in Katoomba) in the Upper Blue Mountains. We will visit historic gardens, villages, and landscapes in the region. Tour also running post conference, 14–16 September. # limited to 48.

#### Optional Day: Thursday 9 September

A mid-morning harbour cruise on the 'James Craig', 1874 tall ship, will be followed by afternoon tours of the *Royal Botanic Gardens* and optional pre-registration.



## Optional Day: Monday 13 September

Tour of the Camden region: we will visit The *Australian Botanic Garden Mount Annan*, the historic town centre of Camden and view recently modified cultural landscapes of surviving colonial estates. Lunch at Denbigh, an early farm complex, will be followed by a scenic drive and visit to the gardens of *Camden Park*, centrepiece of the Macarthur family estate.

## Optional Tour: 14–16 September

Post conference tour of the Blue Mountains, identical to the 6–8 September itinerary
